DISINFECTANTS COME IN THREE MAIN CATEGORIES: Limited

Effective against only a specific major group of microorganisms.

Broad-Spectrum

Used for all three major microorganism groups bacteria, fungi, and viruses. Hospital

EPA-registered formulas used in medical settings - bactericides, virucides, and fungicides.

THE TYPES OF COMMERCIAL DISINFECTANTS TO KNOW ARE:



Alcohols Powerful antiseptic, used in all settings.



Aldehydes

Highly effective broadspectrum disinfectant.



Chlorine Compound

Cost-effective disinfectants for non-porous surfaces.



Hydrogen Peroxide

Excellent for combatting microbial growth.



lodophors

Great for sanitizing equipment, bottles, and containers.



Phenolic Compounds Used in hospitals for tables, bed rails, and

lab surfaces.



Quaternary **Ammonium Compound**

Common sprays and wipes for household use.



USE THE RIGHT MIX!

Some disinfectants need to be mixed or diluted with water. Ratios will vary depending on your needs and the environment! Consult the manufacturer's instructions for guidance.



USE PROPER PPE

All disinfectants may cause irritation when in contact with your body or inhaled. Some, such as phenol compounds, are especially potent and must be handled with a high level of care.



SURFACE SCIENCE

Most disinfectants don't clean a surface; they kill pathogens. Some are designed to do both but may not offer the potency of specialized formulas. A disinfectant's effectiveness depends on the surface type porous or non-porous. The amount of surface contact or dwell time required depends on the type of surface and chemicals used.



REGULATIONS

The EPA regulates disinfectant and sterilant use on environmental surfaces, whereas the FDA regulates disinfectants used on critical semi-critical medical devices.
